Spending 0.45% of its gross national income (GNI) on official development assistance (ODA) in 2022, Belgium partners with 14 countries in sub-Saharan Africa, North Africa and the Middle East. Health is a priority sector for the Belgian Development Cooperation, and access to universal health care is a guiding principle. About 15% percent of Belgium's ODA budget goes to healthcare. Its health interventions focus on strengthening health systems, sexual and reproductive health and rights, and combating HIV/AIDS.

#### GLOBAL MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT

Global mental health programmes supported by the Belgium developent agency Enabel include psychological support for sexual assault victims in the Eastern Congo, a partnership with the NGO Auto-Développement Afrique to provide psychosocial counselling as part of a holistic approach to lift people out of extreme poverty in Rwanda and Burundi, and support for UNICEF to provide psychosocial support to children living in refugee camps in Jordan.

Belgium's leadership in global mental health is demonstrated by the 2018 high-level event in New York to share best practices on psychosocial rehabilitation and the psychosocial well-being of children affected by armed conflict, organised by Belgium

As a trained psychologist, Her Majesty the Queen Mathilde has been a staunch supporter of mental health and since 2016,has been a UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Advocate with a focus on mental health.

### DOMESTIC MENTAL HEALTH

Belgium's mental health care system has undergone <u>many reforms</u> working towards deinstitutionalization.Belgium has a high rate of suicide in comparison to other OECD countries and has supported numerous suicide prevention campaigns.

#### **FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES**

Enabel, the Belgium development agency, publishes grant opportunities on their website. Currently (by May 2023) there is an <u>active call for proposals</u> to enhance the availability and accessibility of mental health and psychosocial support for youth and their caregivers in Palestine. This follows previous calls for proposals for mental health awareness campaigns in Palestine.

According to IHME data, Belgium spent US\$1.1 million on development assistance to mental health (DAMH) in 2020. This figure is only representative of government resources.

GAVI	Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, is focused on increasing the sustainable and equitable use of vaccines worldwide. The current strategy (2021-2025) is narrowly defined with no reference to mental health.

Green Climate Fund	The GCF is the world's largest climate fund, mandated to support developing countries raise and realize their Nationally Determined Contributions (NDC) ambitions towards low-emissions, climate-resilient pathways. Like the GEF, the GCF is also driven by government-identified national priorities.
Food and Agriculture Organisation	The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) is a specialized agency of the United Nations that leads international efforts to defeat hunger. FAO specialises in providing research and analysis to support policy making.
